**Financial Literacy:** the ability to read, analyse, manage, and communicate financial information.

## Grade 9/10

### BTT 10/20 - Information Technology in Business

Students use information technology in a business environment. Students learn how to use computers to perform electronic research, communications and use common business productivity software and design software. This course is highly recommended as a prerequisite for future all high school courses. *Open to all students, of any grade.*

### BBI 10/20 - Introduction to Business

Students learn basic concepts, functions and skills for meeting the challenges of working in a business environment. Students learn concepts and skills related to professional and personal finance, entrepreneurship, accounting, production and marketing. This course provides a great basis for business courses at the senior level. *Open to all students, of any grade.*

## Grade 11/12



### BAF 3M/BAT 4M - Introduction to Financial Accounting

Students learn fundamental principles and procedures of accounting, with an emphasis being placed on service and merchandising businesses. Students develop an understanding of the connections between financial analysis, internal control and the use of financial information for the purpose of making business decisions. Computerized accounting is also introduced.

### BTA 30 / BTX 4C - Information Technology Applications in Business

Students learn about the information technology work environment making use of common business software, conducting electronic research, investigating electronic business and researching post-secondary occupations which require information technology skills.



### BDI 3C- Introduction to Entrepreneurial Studies

This course focuses on ways in which entrepreneurs recognize opportunities, generate ideas, and organize resources to plan successful ventures that enable them to achieve their personal goals, while satisfying the needs of others.
